





RE English Maths

This topic is called Creation and Covenant. In this branch, children will explore the first account of Creation in Genesis as a powerful poetic narrative that reveals Christian beliefs about God as Creator. They will reflect on the idea that God brings order and goodness out of nothing through his Word and Spirit—introducing them to the Christian understanding of the Trinity. Children will learn that all of Creation is a gift from God, declared 'good' and blessed, including humanity, made in the image and likeness of God ('imago Dei'). This belief invites reflection on human dignity, equality, and the importance of rest and gratitude. Pope Francis reaffirms these themes in Laudato Si', where he teaches that Creation is not only a gift but also a responsibility. He calls all people to repair broken relationships—with God, with others, and with the earth—and to live with ecological virtue. Through scripture, psalms, and Church teaching, children will deepen their understanding of God's goodness and the call to care for the world and each other.

As **readers**, we will journey back as far as 480 million years ago with our class text "Stone Age Boy".

As **effective communicators**, we will present the findings of our research and ideas to the class and use this as an opportunity to expand upon our existing general and technical vocabulary.

As writers, we will write about the stone age character in our stories. We will use wonderful adjectives to describe the environment of Stone Age Britain and create our own

Stone Age themed story. We will explore diary writing in the first person, imagining ourselves in a pre-historic world.

## Year 3 Autumn 1 – Through the Ages



Learners will develop their understanding of digital devices, with an initial focus on inputs, processes, and outputs. They will also compare digital and nondigital devices. Next, learners will be introduced to computer networks, including devices that make up a network's infrastructure, such as wireless access points and switches. Finally, learners will discover the benefits of connecting devices in a network.

Children will hear and experience the Gospel story of Jesus healing Jairus' daughter. The story will be repeated in various ways, and through times of discussion, imaginative reflection and creative response, children will learn that they are created by God out of love and for love: they were designed for this purpose, which should inform how they live. children will recognise that people are unique and that our similarities and differences should be celebrated. Pupils will also be given an opportunity to reflect on God's love as the foundation of our self-confidence. In these sessions, we meet for the first time the animated character of AJ and the characters Sophie and Aidan, who will be played by different pupils in each session. They enable pupils to engage with the topics through drama exercises such as hotseating and roleplay.
