





Year 6 Autumn 2 – Britain at War

<p>The topic this half term is called Prophecy and Promise. Children learn how Saul and David were chosen as Israel's first kings, and how David—a humble shepherd—was called to be a servant king. They will explore how David's role points to Jesus, the Good Shepherd, and will make links between David's anointing and the way Jesus is described in the Gospels.</p> <p>Children reflect on Jesus' connection to David through Joseph and the fulfilment of God's promise of an eternal kingdom. They also explore the O Antiphons of Advent, focusing on titles like Key of David and Emmanuel, and are introduced to the Rosary as a traditional Catholic prayer.</p>		<p>The children will read the 2 novels, one classic: The Silver Sword and one modern: The children of Willesden Lane. Both accounts of WWII through the eyes of children and explores the themes of perseverance, hope and love. The Children of Willesden Lane has a Local interest, and is beautifully written, with lyrical descriptions of Lisa's music, this is a moving story as well as a rich resource for teaching about the Holocaust and Kindertransport and the events in Britain during World War II.</p>		<p>Number - Fractions (including decimals and percentages)</p> <p>use common factors to simplify fractions; use common multiples to express fractions in the same denomination</p> <p>compare and order fractions, including fractions >1</p> <p>add and subtract fractions with different denominators and mixed numbers, using the concept of equivalent fractions</p> <p>multiply simple pairs of proper fractions, writing the answer in its simplest form [for example, $[\text{Fraction:}1/4] \times [\text{Fraction:}1/2] = [\text{Fraction:}1/8]$]</p> <p>divide proper fractions by whole numbers [for example, $[\text{Fraction:}1/3] \div 2 = [\text{Fraction:}1/6]$]</p> <p>associate a fraction with division and calculate decimal fraction equivalents [for example, 0.375] for a simple fraction [for example, $[\text{Fraction:}3/8]$]</p> <p>identify the value of each digit in numbers given to 3 decimal places and multiply and divide numbers by 10, 100 and 1,000 giving answers up to 3 decimal places</p> <p>multiply one-digit numbers with up to 2 decimal places by whole numbers</p> <p>use written division methods in cases where the answer has up to 2 decimal places</p>	
<p>Science</p>  <p>Our science topic for this term continues to be 'Our Circulatory System'. We will be learning about the transport role of the human circulatory system, its main parts and primary functions. They learn about healthy lifestyle choices and the effects of harmful substances on the body.</p>		<p>History</p> <p>This project teaches children about the causes, events and consequences of the First and Second World Wars, the influence of new inventions on warfare, how life in Great Britain was affected and the legacy of the wars in the post-war period. We explore key factors that led to World War 1 and World War 2. We also take a trip to the Bentley Priory museum, where we will take part in a workshop exploring the Battle of Britain.</p>		<p>Year 6 Autumn 2 Britain at War</p> 	
		<p>DT</p> <p>MAKE, DO AND MEND</p> <p>This project teaches children a range of simple sewing stitches, including ways of recycling and repurposing old clothes and materials. We relate it to the wartime necessity of not having new clothes for every occasion and needing to have the skills to mend and alter clothing.</p>		<p>PE</p> <p>Dance: Carnival</p> <p>The focus of learning is to create group movements selecting and applying choreography into a routine. Pupils will be able to use their bodies to perform technical movements with control and rhythm. They will learn to create movements from a stimulus creating dances that use compositional principles.</p> <p>Invasion Games: Basketball</p> <p>The focus of the learning is to consolidate pupils ability to use passing, dribbling and moving skills to keep possession and score. The pupils should be able to apply their prior learning of passing, dribbling and moving, to create effective attacking tactics that results in a successful shot.</p>

<p>Web page creation</p> <p>This unit introduces learners to the creation of websites for a chosen purpose. Learners identify what makes a good web page and use this information to design and evaluate their own website using Google Sites.</p> <p>Throughout the process learners pay specific attention to copyright and fair use of media, the aesthetics of the site, and navigation paths.</p>	<p>Created to Love Others explores the individual's relationship with others. Building on the understanding that we have been created out of love and for love, this module explores how we take this calling into our family, friendships and relationships, and teaches strategies for developing healthy relationships and keeping safe both online and in our daily lives.</p> <p>Personal Relationships aims to equip children with strategies for more complex experiences of relationships and conflict. This covers how to respond to spoken and unspoken pressure, the concept of consent and further teaching on how our thoughts and feelings have an impact on how we act. The concept of fairness is introduced, where pupils will consider what bullying, prejudice and discrimination are.
