- ✓ To find out about St. Agnes' EYFS
- ✓ To help you to understand the curriculum your child will be covering in their reception year.
- ✓ To identify the key ways in which you can help your child at home and in school.

What does the EYFS look like at St Agnes?

- ▶ Activities in Reception are carefully planned and organised in order to provide a range of learning experiences.
- ▶ The learning environment (both indoors and out) is set up to ensure children have access to a range of learning opportunities
- ▶ There is a balance of child-led and adult-directed activities
- ▶ Books are an essential part of the planning and are regularly used to plan opportunities across all areas of learning



Learning Through Play

- ✓ Play underpins the delivery of all the EYFS. Children must have opportunities to play indoors and outdoors. It is through play that children develop intellectually, creatively, physically, socially and emotionally.
- ✓ Play is the way adults support young children to learn with enjoyment and challenge (**planned and purposeful play**)

Where do we start?

- ▶ Find out children's interests.
- ▶ **Baseline** - We pinpoint children's development on entry by observing and interacting with them during play-based and child-initiated activities.
- ▶ We use this to make a series of judgements about each child based on a clear set of assessment criteria.

How we assess the children

- Through observations and high quality interactions by all team members
- Tapestry – online journal to record observations
- Focus children
 - Observations feed into future planning and setting of next steps in learning
 - Meet with parents twice per year

Focus Meetings

- ✓ We meet twice a year to discuss focus children
- ✓ Dates communicated to you via Tapestry– it is your responsibility to attend the meeting.
- ✓ The third term is not a meeting- this is an End of Year report.
- ✓ We ask that you also become involved in adding to their portfolio by writing comments and praise for your child's achievements on Tapestry

- ✓ Tapestry: Online Journal which records photos, observations and comments/next step, in line with the Early Years Foundation Stage. You can upload videos/photos too.
- ✓ Read half termly newsletters
- ✓ Parent App
- ✓ Home learning challenges linked to learning in class
- ✓ Parent Workshops with take home resources
- ✓ Phonics weekly tasks
- ✓ Reading books for daily reading



General Information



Daily Routine

- ▶ School starts at 8:55am but children can start coming in from 8:40am. You will be greeted by the TAs at the gate whilst the teachers will be waiting for the children. Any messages must be passed onto the TAs.
- ▶ We always start our day with registration, our morning prayer and carpet session.
- ▶ The children then spend time in free flow, both indoors and out.
- ▶ Before lunch we have another carpet session and prayer.
- ▶ At the end of the day we have a story session and say our end of the day prayer
- ▶ Children need to be collected from outside the classrooms at 3:10pm



Outdoor Learning

- ▶ As the children undertake so much of their learning outside, the outdoor is accessible for the children from 9.30 – 2.45 and we go outside in **all weathers**.
- ▶ To support this, we ask that you ensure your child has suitable clothing e.g. school coat, school hat, scarf, gloves, sun hat & sun cream.
- ▶ There is no such thing as bad weather, just bad clothing!

- ✓ Grey socks
- ✓ No toys/key chains attached to book bags
- ✓ Black shoes NO trainers
- ✓ Every item labelled with your child's name (no siblings etc)
- ✓ No jewellery (stud earrings allowed, to be covered on PE days)
- ✓ Winter: school logo hat, scarf and gloves



Reception uniform



- ✓ White socks or green tights
- ✓ No toys/key chains attached to book bags
- ✓ Black shoes NO trainers
- ✓ Every item labelled with your child's name (no siblings etc)
- ✓ No jewellery (stud earrings allowed, to be covered on PE days)
- ✓ Hair tied at the back
- ✓ NO cardigans



Reception uniform – PE Kit



- ✓ White socks and grey socks
- ✓ Trainers ALL black or ALL white (no laces)

Labelling Uniform

- Please purchase either sew in name labels or sticker name labels.
- Writing in marker or biro blurs/fades and this makes it much more likely your child's uniform will be lost. It is also tricky for your child to read their name at this age.
- Please put the label in somewhere very visible for your child and for adults (not hidden in a pocket for example).
- Sticker name labels usually give the option to add a picture/symbol beside the name- this will help your child (and their friends) to identify their uniform.
- If uniform is second hand or a siblings, please update the name label.

Healthy School



- ✓ A piece of fruit is available from the snack area all day.
- ✓ Milk – you must register your child to receive free school milk. When they turn 5 you can choose to pay for it.
- ✓ If your child brings a packed lunch to school then please ensure that this is healthy and **NUT FREE**.
- ✓ For the first couple of weeks we would like all children to try school dinners instead of a packed lunch.
- ✓ If you would like to send something into school to celebrate your child's birthday please note that we do not accept sweets or cakes only fruit or you can donate a book for the class book area.



Consumables

- ▶ Each half term, we request that each family donate £5.00 for consumables. This money will enable us to do some fantastic cooking, planting and messy play with your children.
- ▶ Please give it to a member of staff in an envelope with your child's name on it at the start of every half term.



House Keeping

- ✓ Any sickness or diarrhoea must be followed by 48hrs absence from the last time the child was sick.
- ✓ Any absence requires a telephone call to the school office and a note explaining why reported through Parent App.
- ✓ Head lice are common! Please check regularly, treat as recommended and let a member of staff know. Shoulder length hair must be tied up.
- ✓ Any medicines can only be administered by prior arrangement. Forms are available at the office.
- ✓ If your child will be collected from someone not on your list, please let us know in the morning
- ✓ Note that Thorverton road has restricted access (no access 8.30-9:15am and 2:30-3:30pm)



Preparing your child for Reception

- ✓ Develop your child's independence skills (dress him/herself, pull his/her pants down/up, use the toilet, wash his/her hands)
- ✓ Read lots of stories together – this will support your child's language and understanding and give them an idea of story structure
- ✓ Listen to Nursery rhymes
- ✓ Support your child in recognising their name. If children are writing their name, encourage them to use a capital letter at the start and then lower case letters.
- ✓ Play together, model taking turns
- ✓ Be creative together (use scissors, pencil)
- ✓ Play number games
