






Year 4 Spring 2: Misty Mountain, Winding River

<p style="text-align: center;">Desert to Garden</p> <p>Children will explore the themes of forgiveness, reconciliation and faithful living during Lent, and how devotion to God naturally leads to good works.</p> <p>They will study key parables, including the Parable of the Lost Son and the Parable of the Judgement of the Nations, to deepen their understanding of God’s unconditional love and the call to respond with mercy, compassion, and service to others.</p> <p>We will also gain an overview of Holy Week through St Matthew’s Gospel, recognising how Jesus is revealed as the servant-Messiah who comes not to be served but to serve. Through these studies, pupils will reflect on how belief in God shapes attitudes and actions, particularly in Lent, and how following Jesus involves loving others, especially the poor and those in need.</p> 	<p>As readers we will first explore Mabel and the Mountain exploring the themes of motivation. Our second text is Fly, Eagle, Fly. This is an adaptation of a Ghanaian tale about reaching your potential.
