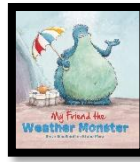
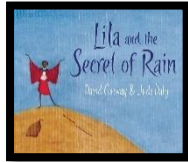




Year 1 Autumn 1 – Our Wonderful World

Our topic this half term is Creation and covenant <u>Children will learn how to:</u> • Recognise or retell the story of Moses and the Burning Bush. • Describe the Trinity using the sign of the Cross. • Describe God as a biblical metaphor. • Have a sense of curiosity about God. • Have a sense of the presence of God in their lives.		As effective communicators we will use subject-specific vocabulary to explain and describe events and experiences. As Readers we will listen to the stories 'Lila and the Secret of Rain' and 'The Weather Monster'. We will use our phonics knowledge to sound out and blend words together. As Writers we will begin to write captions and descriptions using pictures from the story as a stimulus. We will learn new vocabulary that we can use to make our writing more interesting and focus on the use of conjunctions to extend our sentences. 		Place Value within 10: Count to ten, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number. Count, read and write numbers to 10 in numerals and words. Given a number, identify one more or one less. Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least.

We will describe the simple physical properties of everyday materials. We will use our observations and ideas to suggest answers to questions and compare and group together a variety of everyday materials.	We will learn about the compass points, and positional and directional language. We will learn about the equator, hemispheres and continents and are introduced to the countries, capital cities and settlements of the United Kingdom.		We will learn about the purpose of shelters and their materials. We will name and describe shelters and design and make shelter prototypes. Children then design and build a play den as a group and evaluate their completed product.	PE days - Monday and Thursday Ball Skills The unit of work will develop pupils' sending and receiving skills, applying and developing understanding of where we send a ball and why. Pupils will combine their sending and receiving skills to keep possession. Pupils will explore stopping the ball. Wide, narrow, curled (Gymnastics) The unit of work will develop pupils' ability to apply 'champion gymnastics' as they explore movements and balances on big and small body parts in wide, narrow and curled ways on the floor and on apparatus.
